Sermon Discussion Guide for small groups, families, and individuals

"Good News for the Doubters" 1 John 3:11-24 June 14-15, 2014

For Starters

- 1. What stood out from this weekend's message?
- 2. Have there been any doubts in your life that you have overcome?

Digging In

- 1. What does John mean in 1 John 3:20 when he speaks of our "hearts condemning us?" How does this happen?
- 2. What does John mean when he writes in 1 John 3:20 that God is "greater than our hearts and knows everything"? How are these truths encouraging for a Christian?
- 3. What does John mean when he says that we will receive "anything we ask" from God? How are we to understand this in light of the rest of 1 John 3:21-22?
- 4. What are the two commands that God asks us to keep in 1 John 3:23? Why do you believe that these two commandments rise about the rest?
- 5. How does the Holy Spirit assure us that we "belong to the truth and put our hearts at rest" in the presence of God?

Bringing it Home

- 1. Do you struggle with your heart/conscience condemning you? Do you believe you should be a "better Christian" than you are? Do you know others who struggle with this or other doubts about their spiritual lives?
- 2. How does God, knowing everything about you, allow you to be vulnerable and honest, not withdrawn and dishonest?
- 3. How can you approach God with confidence in prayer? How can you grow a personal prayer life that is marked by boldness with God?
- 4. How does believing in Jesus (1 John 3:23) and seeing what he has done for us (1 John 3:16) put our "hearts at rest" in God's presence? Why is this so vital to our spiritual growth?

Digging Deeper

Read and meditate on the Gospel truths of Romans 8:1 and Romans 8:31-39. How do these verses remove our doubts about how God feels about us through Christ?
